Re: Potential 2018 Projects for Grant Consideration

It's time to discuss potential projects for grant consideration as the April 1 deadline will be here before we know it! For the 2018 cycle (due April 1) the Recreation Passport program has increased the maximum grant request amount to \$150,000 and the Land and Water Conservation Fund maximum grant request amount to \$300,000 (total project cost \$600,000). MNRTF remains at a max request of \$300,000.
