As you walk the trails of Tacoma Hills Park, take note of the natural process happening around you known as succession; where over time, open fields transform into forests. You will pass through a variety of habitats including wetlands, meadows and young forests which are home to a great diversity of flora and fauna. Wildlife such as Red Fox, Eastern Cottontail Rabbits, White-tail Deer, Red-tailed Hawks, Great Horned Owls and a variety of songbirds including Field Sparrows and Yellow Warblers call this park home. This property was donated in 1988 by the Ingham County Drain Commission.


