- 4. Central Meridian Regional Trail Connector Late start for contractor and now having difficulty obtaining treated lumber. I am unclear of possible completion date.
- 5. HNC Pavilion and Restroom Building- This project is moving along nicely and is scheduled for completion in mid-November.

Even though there is excitement for hosting large ribbon-cutting events for completed projects, the current Executive Order prohibits gatherings over 100 persons. Therefore, staff will work to plan Facebook Live/Zoom events acknowledging completion of projects and will plan larger, more formal events once public gatherings are permitted.

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE BALLOT PROPOSAL TO

AMEND THE MICHIGAN NATURAL RESOURCES TRUST FUND

At a regular meeting of the <u>Park Commission</u> of the Charter Township of Meridian, Ingham County, Michigan, hosted online amidst the COVID-19 pandemic, on <u>Tuesday, September 8, 2020</u> at 5:30 p.m.

PRESENT: Commissioners Lick, McDonald, Farris, and Stephens

ABSENT: Commission Van Antwerp

The following resolution was offered by Commissioner McDonald and supported by Commissioner Nardo-Farris.

WHEREAS, the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund (MNRTF) has funded public land acquisition and recreation projects with royalties from oil, gas and minerals from public lands in all eighty-three counties in the state since its founding in 1976; and

WHEREAS, projects supported by the MNRTF help Michigan communities protect the state's lakes, streams, lands and wildlife habitats and build recreational facilities for the enjoyment of Michigan residents and visitors, with economic, quality-of-life and public health benefits; and

WHEREAS, every Michigan resident is within a one-hour drive of a state park or recreation area, which are critical contributors to Michigan's \$25.7 billion tourism industry that supports 237,733 direct jobs; and

WHEREAS, Meridian Township has received nearly \$3,000,000 of Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund Grants for acquisition of Eastgate Park, Harris Nature Center, Nancy Moore Park, Legg Park and the Ponderosa Land Preserve, and also assisted in developing the Harris Nature Center, Hartrick Park, pavilions in North Meridian Road Park, Wonch Park, and Harris Nature Center as well as the fishing dock in the Historical Village and paved trails in Wonch Park and Central Park; and

WHEREAS, the Michigan Legislature unanimously voted to remove the accumulated principal limit on the MNRTF once the State Park Endowment Fund reaches its accumulated principal limit of \$800 million, add "renovation and redevelopment" alongside "development" as an allowable use for MNRTF dollars, and change the percentage of funds made available for these projects from a maximum of 25% to a minimum of 25% to match the percentage available for land acquisition projects; and

WHEREAS, Michigan voters will now have the opportunity to approve these changes in the 2020 general election, thus amending Article IX, Section 35 and 35a of the Michigan Constitution; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT MERIDIAN TOWNSHIP PARK COMMISSION, INGHAM COUNTY, MICHIGAN supports the ballot question placed before voters in the 2020 general election to update and expand the MNRFT, guaranteeing investment in conservation and outdoor recreation for generations to come, protecting our natural resources and invigorating our local economies.
