6. <u>FINANCIAL REPORT</u>

a. 2016 Financial Report- Finance Director Mattison provided the DDA an explanation of the 2016 Year End Financial Statement. Director Mattison noted that the 2016 year-end report was not an audited version. Director Mattison explained the various line items include in the financial report as of December 31, 2016. Questions from the DDA Board included information regarding the Celebrate Okemos event and reversed accruals from December 2016 to January 2017.

b. January/February 2017 Financial Report - Director Mattison updated the DDA Board on the January/February 2017 Financial Report. Director Mattison updated the Board on the DDA net income up to February 2017.

a. DDA Debt Payment - Member Spanos proposed making a down payment on the principal of the DDA debt in the amount of \$50,000. Finance Director Mattison stated the Loan Agreement would need to be amended. The payment on the principal would reduce the amount of interest due in total. The DDA Board proposed making a pre-payment on the principal in the amount of \$50,000 if the Township Board would modify the Loan Agreement to allow the first principal payment to be paid in 2022 rather than 2020.

MOTION BY MEMBER WEAVERTO AMEND THE DDA LOAN PAYMENT SCHEDULE TO BEGIN PRINCIPAL PAYMENTS IN 2022 ON THE CONDITION THAT THE DDA WILL MAKE A PRE-PAYMENT ON THE PRINCIPAL IN THE AMOUNT OF \$50,000 IN THE YEAR 2017. SUPPORTED BY MEMBER KORREY. MOTION APPROVED 7-0.

Spring Streetscape Project

In past years, the DDA has financed several spring streetscape projects: hanging and watering 20 flower baskets on the light poles, planting and watering flowers in the eight concrete planters located along sidewalks, installing banners on the light poles, and mowing the roundabout when necessary. Staff needs authorization from the DDA Board to move ahead with arranging the streetscape projects. The following table is a list of cost estimates based on staff research and past invoices from 2015 & 2016.

Vendor	Description	Estimated Cost
Redwood Landscaping	Installation of banners	\$200 (completed)
Van Atta's Greenhouse	Flowers for hanging baskets	\$2,100
Redwood Landscaping	Installation of flowers in planters	\$200
Meridian Township	Water	\$380

The DDA Board allocated \$5,000 for contractual services in the 2015 and 2016 budget. Given the current fiscal situation, the DDA Board may choose to hang the banners and not purchase the hanging baskets, or fully fund the streetscape projects as in previous years. Not purchasing the flower baskets would save on water costs as well as winterization (\$425 annually) and any servicing the irrigation system may end up needing.
