RE: Meridian Township Local Roads Program – Asphalt Rejuvenator

Dear Resident:

Your road has been resurfaced in the last several years as part of the Meridian Township Local Roads Program, funded by the Local Roads Millage. This work was part of the voter-approved initiative to begin the process of bringing all of the local roads in Meridian Township up to a good rating. To extend the life of your new road, the Township will be applying an asphalt rejuvenator to the pavement while it is still in good condition. The full list of roads receiving the rejuvenator treatment this year is provided on the back of this notice.

The purpose of an asphalt rejuvenator is to reverse the effects of deterioration caused by sunlight and water on the pavement, and to delay future deterioration. The rejuvenator is one of the chemicals used to make asphalt. It is what binds the sand, gravel and aggregate together to make asphalt. The rejuvenator absorbs into the asphalt and restores the chemical composition, increasing the flexibility, durability and reducing the permeability of the pavement. **The rejuvenator treatment does not change the texture of the road.**

The application of the rejuvenator is a continuously moving process that is completed one lane at a time. You will have access to your drive at almost all times, except for a 30-60 minute window immediately after the rejuvenator is applied, during which the product cures and a light coat of sand is applied to absorb the excess material and reopen the lane in a timely manner. The sand will swept up within two days.

If you are trying to access the area during installation, please follow the directions of the onsite crew members and do not drive around workers or barricades. If you accidentally enter a freshly treated area, drive SLOWLY (5 mph). This is to prevent the rejuvenator from getting on your car.

If you do end up getting some of the rejuvenator on your car, you can use an auto cleaner to wash off the material. Moreover, if some of the rejuvenator gets tracked onto your driveway, the material will naturally wash off within 3-5 weeks (if it rains), leaving no stain. **Non-motorized users (pedestrians, pets, cyclists, etc.) should avoid the treated area until after the sand has been collected. The road can be slippery while the treatment is curing and while the sand is on the road. This is also to avoid tracking any rejuvenator onto your driveway or into your home.**

In order to achieve a successful application, all vehicles must be removed from the road, and the pavement must be dry. To avoid having to delay or cancel the application on your street, please do not park vehicles on the roadway from the date of this letter, until the sand has been fully removed from the road. Additionally, please turn off sprinklers, and avoid any other activity that would discharge water onto the street (e.g. washing cars) on the day when the application is to take place. You will receive a door hanger the day prior to the application.

Work is anticipated to begin around the last week of May, or the first week of June. The treatment will proceed one street at a time – not all streets will see work begin at this time. The contractor that will be performing this work is Pavement Technology, Inc. They have been safely and successfully applying this asphalt rejuvenator for over 50 years.
