A. Start at Meridian Farmers Market bike repair station.

- Riders will take a scenic ride toward Lake Lansing. (optional: cross the tracks to the InterUrban Pathway) - **A2**
- Note the floating bio-filters - special "islands" that clean stormwater run-off from the Mall.

B. **GreenStop:** Lake Lansing Park South now features a bioswale and natural shoreline demonstration.

C. Don Lillrose Perennial Garden: This perennial garden provides a pedestrian and pollinator habit while beautifying the neighborhood.

D. Cameron Residence: Natural Shoreline and Lake-Friendly Landscaping. Art and Marlene are not likely available so this will be a bike-by but you can see the decades of gardening that have gone in to this lovely landscape. Art is a retired professor from MSU Dept of Horticulture and former director of MSU Horticultural Gardens.



E. Meridian Recycling Center: This will be a bike-by the entrance. More at www.reclaimedbydesign.com

F. **GreenStop:** Haslett Community Church: this site features a large solar array and several pollinator gardens. Additional native plantings have recently been completed. Alternative Return Route: This off-road alternative route runs through a diverse natural area behind Haslett High School.
