Sierra Ridge Flowage Easement
 Ingham County Drain Commissioner's Office representative Dave Love presented the request for a flowage easement through Township property (presentation included in meeting packet)

- Concerned about the quality of water flowing into the Land Preserve from the development
- Drain Commission plan to install a rain garden on the east side of the culvert and will be responsible for the management of the rain garden

BOARD MEMBER BRIXIE MOVED, BOARD MEMBER STEPHENS SECONDED, TO RECOMMEND THE TOWNSHIP BOARD APPROVE THE FLOWAGE EASEMENT WITH THREE CONDITIONS:

- 1) A RAIN GARDEN BE INSTALLED TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF THE WATER FLOWING INTO THE LAND PRESERVE.
- 2) THE DRAIN COMMISSION INCLUDES EDUCATIONAL SIGNAGE NEAR THE RAIN GARDEN ABOUT THE IMPORTANCE OF THIS NATURAL FEATURE
- 3) THE DRAIN COMMISSION USE NATIVE, SALT-TOLERANT PLANTS IN THE RAIN GARDEN.

- Inquired about the Costigan Drain in the Forest Grove Land Preserve

2017 Prescribed Burn Tabulation


The bid for the 5 acre prescribed burn at Davis Foster Land Preserve was extended to 3 companies and all 3 responded with bids as follows:



Davis Foster Land Preserve Burn Unit 4




