There are 49,000 connects in Michigan and over 2,600 connects in the county. The cost is \$9.95 and no taxes.

RULE 2: MEMBERSHIP

2.1 Members. The Commission shall consist of five (5) regular members and two (2) alternate members appointed by the Township Board of the Charter Township of Meridian. The Commission may recommend names of suggested appointees to the Township Supervisor. Members must be residents of the Township. No Commission member may:

1. Be employed by a locally franchised cable company.
2. Hold a contract with a locally franchised cable company.
3. Have ownership interest in a locally franchised cable company.

2.2 Alternate Members.

1. An alternate member shall be called to serve in place of a regular member by the chairperson or vice chairperson if:
 - a) a regular member is absent from or will be unable to attend two or more consecutive meetings of the Commission; or,
 - b) a regular member is absent from or will be unable to attend meetings for a period of more than thirty (30) consecutive days; or,
 - c) a regular member will be abstaining from participating in consideration of a case in which the regular member has a conflict of interest.
 - d) When called to serve, an alternate member has the same voting rights as a regular member.
 - e) Alternate members may be called in any order.

- 3) Is it mandatory for the builder to check for these utilities to be available before closing the home?

Re: HOMTV Programming Summary (January - November, 2017)

At the beginning of 2017, HOMTV launched a new website. The site was streamlined and made easier to navigate for visitors, allowing over 8,500 visitors with an average search time of one minute. This search time means that visitors are able to navigate through the home page and quickly locate the information. Attachment A shows unique pageviews (straight searches to homtv.net), entrances (click through from external links), bounce rate (viewed and left page) and exit percentages (click through to another homtv sponsored site like YouTube or Facebook).

2017 marked the first year utilizing Swagit for HOMTV's Video On Demand and Live streaming services. Our previous software, Granicus, was not very reliable and offered poor viewer ratings. With the upgrade, homtv.net streams at HD quality (up to 1080p) on the entire archived library of programs. This new HD streaming generated 25,610 visitor views with an average watch time of 7:20 minutes. Attachment B shows that viewers are using the website to watch Township meetings Live as they happen and to also access our archived library of content. HOMTV continues to improve and change to meet the trend in the industry of allowing for more on demand services and viewers to stream live from all mobile devices.

Facebook is also becoming a great place for HOMTV to connect with viewers from a video standpoint. The video views on Facebook are at 15,900, which is an increase from 8,200 views in 2016 (Attachment C). These numbers confirm a positive trend as the TV/Broadcasting industry continues to move to more digital platforms.

The HOMTV YouTube channel, featuring promotional and current event video coverage, has also seen an increase in viewership during 2017 with 13,212 video views, which is an increase from 6,849 during 2016 (Attachment D). This shows a positive trend of providing HOMTV viewers instant access to the content. News stories are now being produced individually and uploaded to the HOMTV YouTube channel allowing viewers to watch individual stories instantly, rather than a full show episode, like Meridian News Now.

These reports confirm that HOMTV continues to remain relevant and on target with the digital trend of watching/streaming various forms of media.

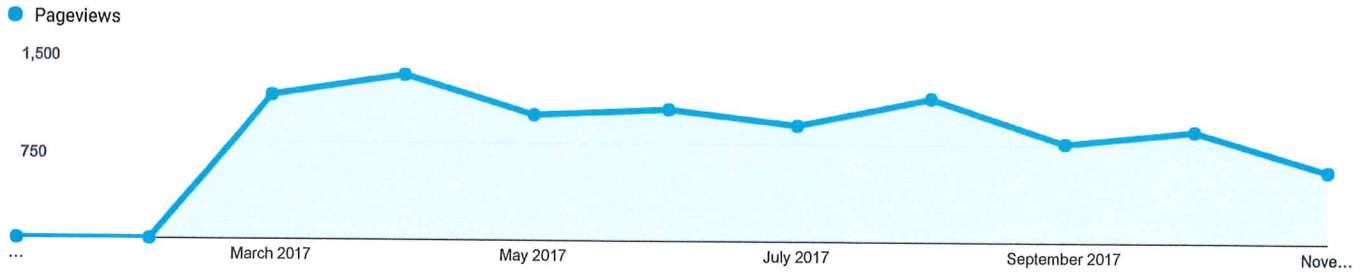

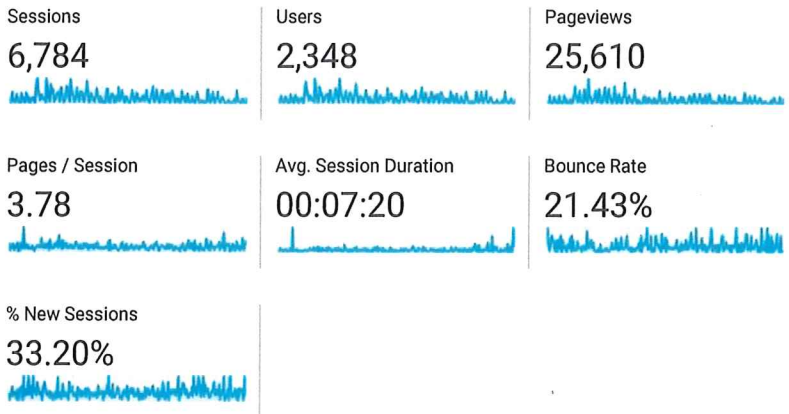

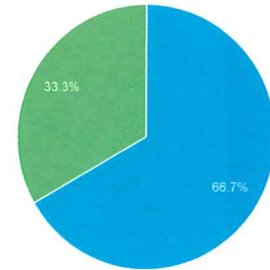
